Player Tryout Information

Tryout Times:	<p>The tryout will be by age group (birth year). Check your times carefully as they are not all in age order.</p> <p>September 9, 2017:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • U19 (1999 - 2001) – 9am to 11am • U12 (2006 / 2007) – 11am to 1pm • U14 (2004 / 2005) – 1pm to 3pm • U16 (2002 / 2003) – 3pm to 5pm <p>Please arrive at least 30 minutes early to check-in, obtain your bib and ID#, and warm up. However, you should allow an extra 15 minutes (arrive at least 45 minutes early) if you did not pre-register online.</p> <p>NOTE: Additional times may be added on September 9 and 10 if and as necessary. Players must be available both days to attend additional times if required.</p> <p>Pitchers & Catchers: Time permitting, the try-out may include evaluation of prospective pitchers and catchers, with priority focus on players new to a prospective teams / coaches. Catching gear will be provided, or you may bring your own.</p>
Location:	Loutet Softball Park , 1700 Rufus Ave, North Vancouver, BC (map link)
Registration:	Save time by pre-registering online at http://nsgfa.ca/rep . Online registration closes at 12 Noon on September 8, 2017. If you have not registered by then, you will need to register in person at the tryout.
Cost:	The tryout is completely free.
Process and Guidelines:	<p>The tryout and team forming process is subject to Rep Program Guidelines established by the NSGFA Rep Committee (posted on our website), and applicable NSGFA and Softball BC rules and requirements. All decisions by the Rep Committee are final.</p> <p>Players are responsible for arriving at the correct time and location for the applicable tryout. Tryout participation does not guarantee placement on a rep team, or there will be a rep team for a particular age group. Players selected for a rep team are required to register and pay applicable fees in full by the deadlines established by the NSGFA.</p>
What to wear and bring:	<p>Players should dress appropriately for the weather and for softball activities (e.g. proper clothing, cleats, hair tied back, jewelry removed). Each player needs to bring her own glove, helmet, water, and snacks. Players may bring their own Fastpitch approved bat, or use one of the bats provided at the tryout.</p> <p>Players should NOT wear clothing identifying their name or affiliation with prior teams.</p> <p>For warmer weather, we also recommend a ball cap, sun screen, sun glasses, extra water, and a spare sweatshirt/hoodie in case it is breezy. If there is a risk of cool / wet weather, we recommend wearing a ball cap and dressing in layers (e.g. hoodie/sweatshirt, light wind</p>

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	<p>breaker and/or rain coat). The tryout may be delayed or postponed if it is too wet to proceed on the scheduled date and time.</p>
<p>Injuries and Conflicts: IMPORTANT!</p>	<p>If a player is injured or, due to a permissible conflict, cannot make the designated tryout time due to a permissible conflict, she is to register online for the tryout and notify the Rep Committee in writing prior to the tryout date. Such notification is to be by email from the particular player/parent to the Rep Coordinator (rep@nsfastpitch.ca) and cannot be via a coach or another player, parent or proxy. A doctor's note may be required. Attending another softball association tryout is not considered a permissible conflict.</p> <p>Unless otherwise approved, injured players are to come to the tryout. Players with approved conflicts will be granted the opportunity to attend a secondary tryout (date and time determined by the Rep Committee). Secondary tryouts for other players MAY be scheduled at the sole discretion of the Rep Committee, and may be restricted to specific players or age groups. Players participating in a secondary tryout are not guaranteed a spot on the team regardless of how well they perform.</p>
<p>Out-of-District Players:</p>	<p>All eligible players including those from outside the North Shore and Softball BC District 4 are welcome and encouraged to participate in the tryout. There are <u>NO RESITRCTIONS on cross-boundary players</u> and no forms/permits are required.</p>
